So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away.

Church on Thursday, May 17th at 7 p.m. . . . Church on Thursday? How many times does that happen? Just twice a year: Maundy Thursday of Holy Week and on Ascension Day.

Ice cream on Ascension Day? What's that all about? Well, the ice-cream is actually after the worship service, but it's part of the celebration of Christ's Ascension on high to "fill all things" – assuming "all power in heaven and on earth" and giving gifts to all people (not ice-cream, rather): . . . *He gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, Ephes. 4:11-13 (ESV)*

The ice-cream is reminiscent of the clouds that took our Lord out of the sight of the apostles as the angels bid them focus on the business at hand of being Christ's witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and to the end of the earth.

Christ's ascension makes us think also of His return in glory which Jesus described saying, "*you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven.*" **Mark 14:62 (ESV)**

Come join us to sing out and ring out that Christ is risen, ascended, reigning and returning to fill full all that He has purchased and won by His perfect sacrifice for our salvation.

Come celebrate Christ's Ascension!

Vicar's Corner

What is Pentecost all about?



Acts 2:1-4

¹When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

This past month I was reading an article about Pentecost by Rev. Dr. Quill and really liked his insights on the season of Pentecost. So here are some of the points that I really enjoyed on the season of Pentecost.

When you hear the account of Pentecost, what do you think of? As we see from the passage in Acts, Pentecost was like an exciting Christian fireworks-filled Fourth of July! It had tongues of fire, violent winds, loud "dynamic" preaching, three thousand baptisms, and instant language ability. Luther gives a great summary of what Pentecost is in his explanation to the third article to the Apostle's creed in the Small Catechism. Luther writes, "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith

There is no believing without the Holy Spirit. That was

true in the 16th century when Luther wrote his Small Catechism, it is true today, and it will be true in the future when we leave here and travel to distant lands. It has been true from the very beginning, when it all began on the Day of Pentecost. Jesus accomplished our salvation through his sacrificial death on the cross. After his ascension into Heaven, the risen Lord Jesus continued the work of salvation by distributing his saving gifts, namely, the forgiveness of sins, through preaching, Baptism, and the Breaking of Bread/Lord's Supper. Pentecost was about preaching the Word of Christ and about baptizing in the name of Christ for the forgiveness of sins.

A lot of exciting things happened in Jerusalem on the Day of Pentecost. But we must not lose sight of the essential things. Pentecost was and is about the preaching—preaching Jesus Christ crucified and risen. Pentecost was and is about the Holy Spirit. It was the Holy Spirit who gave to the apostles what they were to clearly proclaim in the streets of Jerusalem. Thus the Holy Spirit was the real preacher on Pentecost even as he is the real preacher today. On that day the Holy Spirit preached through our Lord's Apostles. Today the Holy Spirit preaches through pastors when they faithfully proclaim what has been given them to say by the same Spirit through his inspired Holy Scriptures—that is, Jesus Christ crucified and risen. As we start the season of Pentecost later this month, may you be reminded of the work that the Holy Spirit is doing in your life and here at Reformation!

UN-APPROVED MINUTES for CHURCH OF THE REFORMATION-LUTHERAN
Church Council Meeting, April 12, 2012

PRESENT: Mark Bliese, Brenda Hargett, Jack Jeffcott, Linda LaFlamme, Dan Reimler, Dale Thielker, Lee Thielker, Hal Uthoff, Pastor Pelsue, Vicar Hartwig, Julia Graudin, Derek Hotzel, and Dan Kamp were absent but excused.

The meeting was called to order at 7:36 p.m. A quorum was present. Linda LaFlamme had the devotion. She had a reading from Hebrews 7. It was a Faith Aflame 360 degrees devotion on being living sacrifices. Pastor will have the May devotion.

The minutes of the March 8, 2012 Church Council meeting were reviewed. Lee Thielker moved to approve the minutes as read. Brenda Hargett seconded his motion. The motion carried unanimously.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Derek Hotzel communicated to Hal Uthoff that he had asked for an update on the Ad-hoc committee on finances' progress. Lee Thielker stated they will be having a meeting after late church on April 15. They have received suggestions for proposed projects

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Hal stated he will be consulting with Pastor on members for a nominating committee to fill the vacant position of Chairman of the Board for Evangelism.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Lee Thielker presented Dan Kamp's report on the monthly income summary for March 2012. Regular envelopes amounted to \$15,952, Lenten offerings were \$1,327, with a subtotal toward budgeted expenses was \$17,758.90. The total income toward expenses was \$20,240.91. The full reports can be viewed on the bulletin board near the nursery.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Dale Thielker reported that we are current on all obligations. We had expenses of \$18,355 for March. There were \$1,586 in non-budgeted expenses. Only one notable expense of \$100 for 500 Welcome Brochures was reported.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor reported on Katharina Bartesch's memorial service, which was held at Laclede Groves. Pastor preached for the service. Pastor has made numerous visitations on members who have been hospitalized or homebound. Pastor thought Holy Week services were well attended except the Easter Vigil, which was down in attendance from last year. Pastor thanked Vicar, Fieldworker Matt Resner, Rev. Gerike, Christus Family Choir, Bell Choir, and special instrumentalists. Three youth will be confirmed on April 29; John Lewis, Karlee and Kasey Duneman. The Profession of Faith is April 22. Pastor stated the circuit meeting is being held at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in North City. Pastor stated that \$20,000 was raised for the Vitae Society at its dinner. Pastor wanted to give special thanks to Pat Stelzer for her years of service at The Church of the Reformation-Lutheran. Pastor passed around the new Stained Glass Brochures for all council members to see. Pastor and Mark Bliese will be attending the Missouri District Convention in Springfield on June 4-6 as congregational representatives. The Wednesday morning Bible study is on the Gospel of St. Matthew. Luther's two kingdom theology is being discussed on Sunday morning. Pastor will be showing the Walther Movie in the beginning of May, as May 7 is the 125th anniversary of the death of C.F.W. Walther.

VICAR'S REPORT: Vicar had numerous visits with homebound and hospital stay members. He has preached four times recently, is holding Sunday morning Bible study on the Apostles' Creed for the 7th and 8th grade class. Monday night Bible study is finishing Galatians. They will do a short Bible study next. He felt his Evangelism Module went well. Approximately 34 people helped and he has received numerous thank you notes for the event. He concluded by informing us about his recent vacation.

BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP: Linda LaFlamme thanked Diana Meyer for going through the member database with Sheri. They will be calling each member to update their talent cards. She will highlight the eight principles of stewardship on the Bulletin Board in the hallway. She attended two of the Kitchen Sink workshops at the Missouri District headquarters. She is working with Pastor on a powerpoint Bible study for the fall to emphasize stewardship. Hal asked about the e-scrip program, and Linda has not heard from Dan Kamp if the paperwork has been filled out.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM: Vacant. Pastor stated that half-sheet flyers have been sent out to the community inviting them to Ascension Day services and Mother's Day services. This was funded by our membership in the Chamber of Commerce.

BOARD OF FELLOWSHIP: Julie Graudin was absent, but Pastor reported that \$216 was raised between the Superbowl party and St. Patrick's Day party. These funds will be matched by Thrivent and contributed toward the Elementary Education Tuition program. Ascension Day Ice Cream Social will be held May 17 after the evening service.

BOARD OF ELDERS: Dan Reimler stated the elders met March 7. The elders discussed mailing newsletters to inactive members. Hal asked what is being done with inactive members. BOARD OF FINANCE: Dale Thielker presented Lee Thielker's report, noting we had a surplus of \$1,117 for the month of March. We have \$21,227 cash available for budgeted expenses, and the Vicarage Fund has a balance of \$10,549.

BOARD OF EDUCATION: Brenda Hargett reported the Board of Education met and discussed VBS plans for the young and old alike. A bake sale will be held on Mother's Day to help defray the cost of materials and food for VBS, as no funds have been budgeted. The theme for the VBS will be "I Spy Chrismons". The board also discussed the possibility of having people sponsor care packages for our college students for the 2012-13 school year. The students would also receive the Higher Things magazine. The cost of the magazine is \$15 per student. The care package could consist of gum, cookies, energy bars, cards, and letters from people throughout the school year. We will be asking members to help us with this project. Three families have signed up for the Elementary Education Tuition Program. The Sunday school children sang "Hosana" with the Christus Family Choir on Palm/Passion Sunday and also passed out Alleluias on Easter Sunday. Hal Uthoff asked if she attended the Kitchen Sink Workshops. She did and she gave a short report on the workshops she attended.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

- A recommendation was made to have a recognition and farewell for Pat Stelzer. Pastor will work with Julie on a sheet cake. Pastor will check with Pat when she could be here for the event. Lee Thielker moved to have Pastor move forward with this recommendation. Linda LaFlamme seconded his motion. Motion carried unanimously.
- A request for the use of our facilities by the Windsor Theater Group for their June musical revue production of "Music of the 1940's" was presented in writing by Jeff Stewart, Co-founder/Artistic Director. Hal had looked over the written proposal with a "lawyer's eye" and made notes, which he attached to the proposal. After discussion and consideration of the proposal, Dan Reimler moved that we not accept the proposal. Jack Jeffcott seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

ADJOURNMENT: Dale Thielker moved to adjourn. Brenda Hargett seconded the motion. Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m., closing with the Lord's Prayer.
