TO PAT STELZER!





From the Stewardship Board ...

I am hoping that all of the mothers at Reformation had a great Mother's Day. Before we know it Father's Day will soon be here. When I think of Christian stewardship I cannot think of many gifts from God more precious than our children. I say "our" children, but really they belong to God. He places them in our care and we provide them with everything they need to grow into honest, hard-working Christians.

We practice good Christian stewardship of our children when we properly care for and nurture them. We are practicing good stewardship when we teach our children about God and our salvation through Jesus Christ, when we go to parent-teacher conferences and when we "practice what we preach".

Some children are not so fortunate. Their

parents take the gift that God has given them and destroy it. According to the Bureau of Justice Statistic in 2005 there were 333 children under the age of 5 years killed in the U.S. by one of their parents. This not only violates the fifth commandment, it violates the law. These are tragic events rightly called homicides. What I did not find on the Bureau's website was the 820,151 abortions that were also done that same year. They were not listed there because they are not categorized as homicides by our culturethey are legal under our current civil law, though not by God's Law.

We are all good stewards when we get involved by reaching out to troubled women and sharing God's word with them or helping to support a crisis nursery. There are many organizations out there that aid troubled pregnant women as well as those new parents who are struggling to care for a baby. And these organizations can always use help. Currently in our narthex we are sponsoring a diaper and financial drive for Thrive, one of St. Louis' best places of support for troubled women.



UN-APPROVED MINUTES for CHURCH OF THE REFORMATION-LUTHERAN
Church Council Meeting, May 10, 2012

PRESENT: Mark Bliese, Julia Graudin, Brenda Hargett, Derek Hotzel, Jack Jeffcott, Linda LaFlamme, Dan Reimler, Dale Thielker, Lee Thielker, Hal Uthoff, Pastor Pelsue, Vicar Hartwig. Dan Kamp arrived late because of family obligations.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. A quorum was present. Pastor had a devotion, where he read a commentary from Martin Luther on the Psalms. He then had the church council read responsively Psalm 98 by half verse. Vicar will have the devotion for June, as it will be his last council meeting.

The minutes of the April 12, 2012 Church Council meeting were reviewed. A correction was noted in the Board of Education report. The word "Hosana" should be "Hosanna". Brenda Hargett moved to approve the minutes as corrected. Jack Jeffcott seconded her motion. The motion carried unanimously.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: No report.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT: No report.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Lee Thielker presented Dan Kamp's report on the monthly income summary for April 2012. Regular envelopes amounted to \$19,106.50, Maundy Thursday offering was \$338, Good Friday was \$557, Easter was \$1,635, with a subtotal toward budgeted expenses was \$22,818.68. Jehoiada chest offering was \$355, with a total income of \$25,563.62 for the month. The full reports can be viewed on the bulletin board near the nursery.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Dale Thielker reported that we are current on all obligations. We had expenses of \$17,408 for April. There were \$1,476 in non-budgeted expenses. Notable items from the expenses were \$113 for Confirmation, \$159 for the fire system inspection and \$190 for Easter lilies.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor reported that because of his recent hospitalization he was not able to do a planned wedding. He thanked Pastor Landskroener for stepping in. Pastor stated there were no deaths or funerals this past month. Pastor is working on Bible studies, he is catching up after his illness. Pastor reported on the circuit meeting at Bethlehem Lutheran in north city. Pastor and Vicar went to a conference held by Family Research Council. Pastor reported that he has been working with the elders on a comprehensive program to address our membership issues. Pastor stated that Sunday morning Bible study time will show the Walther movie starting on May 6. Pastor stated that he received word from Pastor Mark Steiner, a son our our congregation, that his congregation in Gulfport, LA voted to disband. He also stated that Pastor Landskroener's congregation, Epiphany Lutheran in Holly Hills, was voting to remove him as their pastor.

VICAR'S REPORT: Vicar had numerous visits with homebound members during Pastor's illness. He continues to preach his scheduled times. He is using a 5 DVD session called "In the Word - 1 Corinthians 15", produced by Concordia Seminary for his Monday night Bible study. He attended the circuit meeting with Pastor and he won \$100 gift card for attending. He is working with John Schilling on the Boy Scouts of America's "God and Church" award.

BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP: Linda LaFlamme reported that 17 individuals signed up for the eScrip program on Sunday, May 6. Other members have signed up at the stores, so she doesn't have an exact count of our participation. She wanted to thank Diana Meyer and Amy Hotzel for helping with the sign-up. They will hold another sign-up the Sunday after Mother's Day. Linda sent her powerpoint presentation on stewardship to Pastor for his approval. The stewardship board will continue calling members to get the talent cards updated and computerized.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM: Vacant.

BOARD OF FELLOWSHIP: Julie Graudin reported that an ice cream social will be held after the Ascension service. A freewill offering will be taken to defray the costs for our upcoming VBS. Julie stated that Pat Stelzer's farewell reception will be held June 3. June 24 will be a movie event after late service, July will be the VBS, August 12, will the farewell potluck for Vicar Hartwig and his family. August 26 will be the tentative date for the church picnic. September we will hold a talent show and October will be a fall event, maybe having a Reformation theme.

BOARD OF ELDERS: Dan Reimler stated the elders met May 2. Approved the transfer out of the Bugala family; Steve, Rebecca, children Thomas, Clare and Anna, along with Steve's mother Florence to Christ Memorial. Removal by self-exclusion of Susan Autry, Scott DePriest, Milton Seibert, Wanda Thein, Eunice Ziegelbein. He noted the death of August Heinze, September 25, 2008, but he also noted that we were not informed of his death by his family. We were continuing to send the newsletters to his home and the family was reading them. Julie asked about items left in the pews after services - who's responsibility is it to police the pews. It was stated it is the responsibility of the ushers to do this. Hal asked how funerals are announced to the membership. Pastor stated we use memberConnect, an automated service to call every member to notify them of deaths. If the death occurs before a Sunday it is announced in church.

BOARD OF PROPERTIES: Jack Jeffcott reported that the safe handle has been repaired. This repair is "ok", but the ultimate solution is to spend \$100-\$150 to have the safe company repair it. Jack stated the drains in the nursery are running slowly, so he will check into this. He noted that a fellow came looking for work to pay for bus tickets. Pastor asked him to paint the window framing outside the offices. He paid him \$25. Hal asked if we have a pest service, Pastor stated we do. If you see a pest problem, let Jack know so it can be reported to the company.

BOARD OF FINANCE: Dale Thielker presented Lee Thielker's report, noting we had a surplus of \$5,410 for the month of April, with a year-to-date surplus of \$4,463. We have \$26,914 cash available for budgeted expenses, and the Vicarage Fund has a balance of \$9,828. Hal asked a question about our finances - What is in the checking/savings accounts? How are the bills paid? Dan stated we have about 5 weeks of money to pay bills currently. He also explained how we use the checking/savings.

BOARD OF EDUCATION: Brenda Hargett reported the Sunday school will use the Deluxe Children's Bulletins for this summer, which follows the Gospel readings. The Christmas program has been picked. The Sunday school will go back to using individual classrooms this fall instead of the large group sessions that have been used. The Sunday school superintendent will mail out invitations to new 3 year old members. I Spy Chrismons will have three sessions, July 11,18,25. Dinners will be brats, Men's Club pancakes and shredded pork roast sandwiches and salad buffet. Carol and Joyce Drechsel are evaluating the existing Chrismons to see what can be repaired or is in need of replacement. A group of individuals will need to collect supplies and package them for individual crafting. Activities for the children will be led by Kathleen Resner and devotions to end the evening will be provided by Pastor and Vicar.

OLD BUSINESS:

- A report was given by the Ad-hoc financial committee. It was discussed by the council, and the committee asked if the proposal was a good working start. The council agreed, and the committee will come back to the council in June with specific recommendations. They would also like this "Exceptional Gift Process" to be made into an ongoing resolution, which will ultimately be presented to the voters.
